**LOW-COST IMMUNIZATION CLINIC AT SIX FLAGS MALL
BEGINS AUGUST 9**

Junior League of Arlington provides assistance to Tarrant County organization that provides immunizations for \$10

(ARLINGTON, Texas, August 1, 2007) – Just in time for the upcoming school year, the Immunization Collaboration of Tarrant County presents an Immunization Clinic at Six Flags Mall for two weekends in August. Parents are asked to bring their child’s shot records with them to the on-site clinic. The event at Six Flags Mall is estimated to provide services to more than 5,000 Tarrant County children, 2,000 children from Arlington.

The ICTC is a collective effort of the Tarrant County Health Department and several Tarrant County-based businesses and organizations, such as the Junior League of Arlington, to provide a convenient and inexpensive opportunity for local children to receive required immunizations. Last year the ICTC provided 13,000 shots to 5,000 children at immunization events over 29 days in eight locations throughout Tarrant County. Since its inception in 1991, the ICTC has provided immunizations to over 58,000 children in Tarrant County.
