- 1. Community Service:** In our 36 years of serving Arlington (29 as a member league of the Association of Junior Leagues International, Inc.), we have continually responded to community needs. Since becoming a Service League in 1975, JLA has donated more than \$3 million and 1 million volunteer hours to more than 100 non-profit agencies. Members donate approximately 20,000 hours annually for community service and work with more than 20 community programs and agencies. This year JLA will donate funds to organizations including the AIDS Outreach Center, All Star Equestrian Foundation, Arlington Public Library, Back-to-School Fair with the AISD, Boys & Girls Clubs of Arlington, Camp Fire USA, Community Partners of Tarrant County, Immunization Collaboration of Tarrant County and SafeHaven of Tarrant County.
- 2. Leadership and Training Opportunities:** Training for our volunteers is so important to us that it's a part of our mission. Throughout the year, we offer members the opportunity to develop their own potential through special seminars and workshops. Members are encouraged to take on leadership positions that provide for personal growth and the development of skills easily transferred to professional and personal lives.

JLA is a diverse group of more than 450 members who donate their time to serve our community.
