We invite you to join us in accomplishing these goals by submitting an application for a 2017-2018 Community Project in the area of Abuse Prevention.

COMMUNITY PROJECTS

The Junior League of Arlington (JLA) makes a difference in the community by providing trained volunteers to non-profit agencies that align with our focus area. Some of the agencies also receive funding for important projects. To be considered for a Community Project, you must submit an application prior to the deadline, your organization must be a 501(c)(3) or government entity, and your proposal must include volunteer opportunities for our members to serve at least 60 hours. The time frame for these volunteer placements is June 1, 2017, through May 31, 2018. **All applications must be submitted by October 21, 2016.**

This year our application will be accessible online for you to print and return via e-mail to the Research and Development Committee. To be considered for a Project, you will need to attach:

- a copy of the agency's IRS 501(c)(3) determination letter,
- a program budget, and
- a current budget, showing actual expenditures and income to date

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Community Project Guidelines

Mission:

The Junior League of Arlington is an organization of women committed to promoting voluntarism, to developing the potential of women, and to improving communities through effective action and leadership of trained volunteers.

Purpose:

The purpose of the Junior League of Arlington is exclusively educational and charitable.

Project:

Projects shall be compatible with the Junior League of Arlington's focus area: Abuse Prevention

Volunteer Criteria

Projects shall provide quality opportunities for volunteer service and development of Junior League member volunteers. Volunteers shall effectively impact the focus area.

- I. Volunteer opportunities will offer training and experience to Junior League members, utilizing Junior League members' strengths and talents and/or further developing their potential.
- II. Volunteer opportunities with a variety in scheduling will receive priority consideration (i.e. summer concentrated, evenings, weekends).
- III. Junior League members are required to complete 60 hours or approved task completion. Summer opportunities should begin June 1 and end August 31. School Year opportunities should begin September 1 and end May 31.

Additional Information:

Any approved project requires a written contract between the Junior League of Arlington and the agency, which shall be a 501(c)(3), non-profit corporation or tax-exempt government entity.

The Junior League of Arlington will not consider requests for the following:

- Political Activities
- Religious Instruction
- Fundraising Activities
- Operation Funds
- Capital Projects
