FACT SHEET

MISSION The Junior League of Arlington is an organization of women committed to promoting voluntarism, developing the potential of women and to improving the community through the effective action and leadership of trained volunteers. Its purpose is exclusively educational and charitable.

VISION Trained, committed volunteers making a difference in the Arlington community.

HISTORY The Junior League of Arlington, Inc., was originally founded on October 22, 1975 as the Service League of Arlington and was admitted to the Association of Junior Leagues International, Inc. on February 22, 1982.

MEMBERSHIP The Association of Junior Leagues International, Inc. (AJLI) includes 293 Junior Leagues with over 170,000 members in the U.S., Canada, Mexico and Great Britain. AJLI reaches out to women of all races, religions, and national origins who demonstrate an interest in and commitment to voluntarism. The Junior League of Arlington comprises more than 500 Active, Provisional and Sustaining members combined, representing an ethnically diverse, professional membership.

FUNCTION As a volunteer training organization, the Junior League of Arlington offers numerous educational opportunities for League members. Members donate approximately 20,000 hours annually for community service and work with more than 20 community programs and agencies.

FUNDING League projects and grants are supported by funds raised from two annual events: Holiday Magic in Winter 2008 and the JLA 'Tee It Up for Charity' Golf Tournament in Spring 2008. These events enable the League to initiate new community projects and to continually finance existing projects.

FOCUS The Junior League of Arlington supports and promotes efforts, programs, services and opportunities in two major areas: children's issues and women's concerns.
